### Panin's Note, 1831

Source: "Zapiska Panina," 780-82. Panin was the assistant curator at the time that he drew up this list in April 1831. See Chapter 6. Some extracts:

- "Rector (Ivan Dvigubskii)--This man is so characterless and crafty, with an average intellect, that it is sometimes impossible to know his opinion on even the most trivial subject.
- "Kachenovskii--The heavyweight of Russian letters, learned, but boring.
- "DeCampe--Knows French literature very well, but because he is completely ignorant of the Russian language, he would fail without Courtener, who will be an excellent assistant.
- "Snegirev--Knows Antiquities better than the Latin in which he lectures coarsely and incorrectly.
- "Harvey--Knows the English language soundly and teaches well, but has few students, which may also be said about Rubini.
- "Pogodin--Teaches history excellently. If he leaves the university, it would be difficult to find a replacement for him.
- "Lev Tsvetaev--Teaches Roman law. On good terms with [Prince N. N. Golitsyn, the curator].
- "Sandunov--Knows Russian legislation excellently but has already been sick for a long time and gives little hope for a recovery. Worthy successors should be selected for both of them.
- "Chumakov--A good-hearted man and knowledgeable in his field, but rather weak in his inspector work.
- "Davydov--Wise as Solomon but lost in the trees from the hopelessness of his fate in the field of science.
- "Fischer--Chairman of the Medico-Surgical Academy, excellent professor of the natural sciences.
- "Alexander Fischer--Outstanding son of the worthy father, soundly knows natural sciences and speaks Russian like a native.
- "Heiman--Teaches chemistry very well. Knows and loves his work.
- "Pavlov--Learned and capable; but out of place [teaching physics].
- "Perevoshchikov--Both learned and experienced in astronomy, yet rather garrulous.
- "Reuss--A slow-witted scholar, gifted with the ability to

complicate any matter given to him.

"Shchepkin--Knows mathematics soundly and excellently teaches its higher parts. Is capable in all duties.

"Al'fonskii--Very gifted, especially in surgery.

"Bunge--One of the best professors of the medical

During the cholera he showed himself to be both a Christian and an excellent medic.

"Einbrodt--Takes with honour the place of Loder in anatomy.

"Evenius--Eye doctor, very good.

"Mudrov--Showed great service to the university and humanity in organizing the clinics.


"Richter--Obstetrics, very good in all aspects.

"Strakhov--An honest and unselfish man, one of the best students of Mudrov.


"Toporov--Obstetrics, young man with a sensible intellect, good instructor of midwifery.
